

FIRST COMMUNION



This weekend we welcome to the Lord's Table, for the first time, many children of our community. For several months these children have prepared for this celebration, "When they can be just like everyone else." It is a day deserving of great rejoicing. But, as with all our encounters with the Lord, it also creates an opportunity. After all, this sacrament invites us back to the table of the Lord, again and again.

The Eucharist is the sacrament of maturity. It fashions us to be disciples of the Lord, in an ongoing and continuous work. When we eat this bread and drink this cup we do more than simply participate in a divinely ordered way of receiving Christ.

Through our participation in this sacrament we respond to God's invitation to come to the Lord's Table, and to partake with joy of that banquet which celebrates the new covenant of Christ's sacrificial, self-giving love.

Years ago, Saint Augustine wrote that our participation in this sacrament represents a real commitment to live in conformity with the reality that we confess: "If you are the body and members of Christ, then what is laid on the Lord's table is the sacrament of what you yourselves are, and it is the sacrament of what you are that you receive." As God's children may our lives boldly witness to the faith we profess.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

Today marks the annual World Day of Prayer for Vocations. Today we publically fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Matthew 9:38; Luke 10:2). Please pray that young men and women hear and respond generously to the Lord's call to the priesthood, diaconate, religious life, and societies of apostolic life or secular institutes. Please pray also that our entire community regularly take up the challenge of assisting those who are discerning the Lord's call.

MONTH OF MARY

In this fairest of seasons the Church traditionally honors the Virgin whom the angel hailed as "fairest among women." Our veneration for the Mother of the Lord is intended to foster our life's focus upon the risen Lord. We not only sing joyful Alleluia, but in reflecting upon Our Lady, we desire to imitate the response of the one who first trusted and believed.

Perhaps during this coming month of May we can demonstrate our desire to truly live Easter in making an offering to Mary. Flowers placed before her image in our church, along with the prayers they symbolize are always a beautiful gesture. More beautiful could be the act of praying the Rosary with family or friends, or simply making that offering in our own quiet time. But perhaps the greatest act we may offer this month is striving to live humbly the life of a disciple, as did Mary.

CONFESSIONS

On Saturday May 14, 21, 28 and June 4 a visiting priest confessor will be in the Reconciliation Room. Fortunately, I will be concelebrating Ordination Masses over these days. Even more fortunate, Fr. Dansak, Monsignor Gaston, and Fr. Gigliotti are able to ensure that the opportunity to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation is still available. Please pray for these priests and for those who are soon to undertake diaconal and presbyteral ministry.

TRUTH

It will soon be five months since the interior lighting in our church, has functioned at a reduced capacity. Like many people, I too am frustrated by our inability to resolve this problem. I'm ordinarily a believer that if you throw enough money at a problem it will go away. However in this case, with supply chain shortages, that does not seem to be an option.

Some of the repair/replacement parts have arrived. We're still waiting for additional components. Once all the parts are in place, repairs will be undertaken to restore full lighting to the church.

At the same time we're investigating the cost to replace all of the lighting components. For better and worse, technological advancements in lighting fixtures and controls mean that much of our system is not only obsolete, but parts are no longer being manufactured to undertake repairs. It's frustrating to acknowledge that we will soon need to replace a system, just twenty years old. Unfortunately, though the truth is not always pleasant, it's still true.

FINANCIAL ACCOUNTABILITY

Each fiscal quarter we provide a summary of our financial picture. Unfortunately, a quick evaluation of the numbers does not produce as clear an understanding as desired. We are in much better shape than I imagined possible just two years ago. Unfortunately, from the perspective of prudent, financial practice, we're not where we need to be.

With the supplemental assistance provided by fundraising, memorial gifts and bequests, and other sources of extraordinary income, we're paying our bills. But we're not setting aside enough money to cover the cost of upcoming maintenance actions. Looming on the horizon are several significant expenditures that we'll need to undertake. These include paying the parking lot, replacing heating and cooling equipment, and the installation of a new, interior lighting system.

When the time comes to write these checks we'll need to undertake fundraising actions to cover the expense. We'll also need to live (for a time) with malfunctioning or non-functioning systems. Lacking the ability to be proactive, we can only react to the problem. It's not an ideal method for operation. But at present it's our only option.


