

# **Staying Connected During COVID-19**

I have been keeping the parishioners of our Partner Parishes St. Peter and St. Cecilia in my prayers during this pandemic. I can't even imagine the difficulties you must be facing; balancing family, job, school and everything else that has been made more complicated by COVID-19. During this stress-filled time, I want you to know that our parish continues to care for the spiritual and material needs of our faith community.

Once our church building was closed in March, the partner parishes began to stream Masses, devotions and informational updates to our parishioners via our website and through Facebook. We communicated extensively through our Parish Facebook pages, which increased our social media presence. This also offered another outlet for our streaming liturgies and educational opportunities. We conducted a parish phone outreach especially to the elderly and homebound. We created a Ministry of Hospitality.

During the period of the COVID Pandemic, we've created a number of special Facebook presentations to keep our Partner Parish members up to date with parish events and developments. We also, once our church building opened, created volunteer cleaning crews to sanitize the church and restrooms after each use.

# **COVID-19 and its Impact on our Faith Community**

Our parish weekly offertory was reduced because of our limited Mass attendance at St. Cecilia - but it was greatly assisted by those who sent contributions to the Diocesan Lenten Appeal. St. Cecilia will exceed its highest DLA total from previous years.



Our parish and particularly our societies who participate so fully in parish fund raising events suffered from the loss of fundraising monies. For example, our Christian Mothers had plans for a Spaghetti Dinner in the spring, which had to be cancelled. They were able to collect a wide array of articles which they beautiful displayed and sold at their recent Consignment and Vendor sale.

#### Capital Improvements

Your contributions to our parish help to maintain the facility, making it the center of prayer in our community.

Over the last three years, we completed significant work in the Social Hall, including new doors. We revamped aspects of the rectory, and worked on beautifying the church grounds; the addition of the Mary's Garden with a beautiful statue has encouraged regular praying of the rosary. We undertook the procurement and installation of a bell system that has been a great enhancement of the church and the patch. Many comment on the beauty of the hourly chimes and musical selections.



#### **Ministries at St. Cecilia**

St. Cecilia Parish encourage parishioners to participate in one of our liturgical, social or music ministries. If you are interested, please contact the parish office.

#### **Altar Servers**

Altar servers assist the priest in preparing for Mass. The servers take part in the liturgy by performing tasks to help the priest celebrate the Eucharist. Children in grades 3 and above, or once their first communion is made, are encouraged to become an altar server.

#### **Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion**

These ministers assist the priest in the distribution of Holy Communion.

#### Lectors

Lectors proclaim the word of God during Mass or other liturgical functions and devote time to preparation and understanding of sacred Scripture. To serve the parish in the ministry of Lector, you must be of high school age, be able to read well and proclaim the scriptures loudly and clearly.

#### **Ushers**

The ushers take up the offertory and distribute bulletins after Mass. They also assist as needed with emergencies or other necessary concerns.

#### **Christian Mothers**

The Christian Mothers are a group of lay women who wish to hold true to the teachings of the Roman Catholic Church. Additionally, the Christian Mothers are concerned with the faith-formation of youth and the expansion of their personal faith relationships with Christ Jesus.

#### **Hospitality Ministry**

Ministers of Hospitality help assist ushers at each Mass and also assist those attending in fulfilling the special expectations that need to be observed in light of the pandemic.

#### Cantor

Cantors provide musical support of full and active participation in the liturgy.

#### **Religious Education**

Children of the parish are instructed in the principles of the Catholic faith.

#### Ministry to the Sick and Homebound

Parishioners assist the priest in providing pastoral care to the sick and homebound of the parish. The ministers take the Eucharist to the sick, whether they are at home, a personal care home or a nursing home.
