

Staying Connected During COVID-19

I have been keeping the parishioners of our Partner Parishes of St. Peter and St. Cecilia in my prayers during this pandemic. I can't even imagine the difficulties you must be facing; balancing family, job, school and everything else that has been made more complicated by COVID-19. During this stress-filled time, I want you to know that our parish continues to care for the spiritual and material needs of our faith community.

Once our church building was closed in March, St Peter Parish began to stream Masses, devotions and informational updates to our parishioners via our website and through Facebook. We communicated extensively through our Parish Facebook pages, which increased our social media presence. This also offered another outlet for our streaming liturgies and educational opportunities. We conducted a parish phone outreach especially to the elderly and homebound. We created a Ministry of Hospitality.

During the period of the COVID Pandemic, we've created a number of special Facebook presentations to keep our Partner Parish members up to date with parish events and developments. We also, once our church building opened, created volunteer cleaning crews to sanitize the church and restrooms after each use.

COVID-19 and its Impact on our Faith Community

Our parish weekly offertory was reduced because of our limited Mass attendance at St. Peter - but it was greatly assisted by those who sent contributions by mail or by online giving. This is particularly remarkable because during the same period our parishioners support the 1.2 million campaign capital campaign for our new Social Hall/Rec Center.

Our parish and particularly our societies who participate so fully in parish fundraising events suffered from the loss of fundraising monies. For example, our Lenten Fish Fries, which started out so positively netting over \$18,000 by March 13, had to be discontinued because of COVID. Our spring Bonanza was conducted virtually, which had a very significant negative impact on funds raised.



Capital Improvements

Your contributions to our parish help to maintain our campus, which includes, the church, our offices, the rectory and our new Social Hall/Rec Center, all of which contribute to the enhancement the faith life of our community.

Over the last three years, we conceived, sought authorization, designed, then conducted a capital campaign and constructed our new Social Hall/Rec Center. One of the key purposes for construction of our new facility was to provide additional space for Religious Education classes. This enhancement will greatly relieve the crowding and eliminate the use of the cellar for classroom space in our office building.

As you know our offices are housed is an old convent where the sisters who taught at St. Mary's School lived. The layout of the convent, the small rooms that were the "cells" of the sisters are not conducive to learning nor do they provide adequate space or appropriate accommodations for teachers and students.
